CERTIFICATE OF HIGHER SPECIALIZATION IN MEDICINE (CHSM) NEUROSURGERUY

INTRODUCTION:

The duration of (CHSM) curriculum in Neurosurgery is six Years Students are required to be in full residence in the hospital of the University of Jordan . Part of the courses may be taken in other hospitals approved by the Council of Deans on the recommendation of the Council of the Faculty

of Graduate Studies and the Department of Neurosurgery/ Special. The curriculum is given in one year units, at the end of each, the students are evaluated.

Courses are given in semester credits calculated on 16 weeks semester but are implemented on a whole year basis.

CONDITIONS FOR FULLFILLMENT OF TRAINING:

- 1. The student must perform the operations specified in the attached appendix (1)
- 2. The student must have a log book as specified in appendix (2)
- 3. The student must complete the research project specified in the sixth year before graduation.

FIRST YEAR COURSES General Surgery

Emergency Patient Care (Morning Case Review)(1):

The Chairman of the department meets with the students on call the night before to discuss emergency admission. The student is expected to present the case and put forward a diagnosis and a plan of management . He is expected to defend his diagnosis and retionalize his planned management and to have reviewed relevant literature about the presented case.

Duration:

(1) hour twice weekly for (40) weeks.

Evening Case Review "Evening Closing Rounds":

Students are required to report on problematic cases in the ward , when on call, and to discuss them with the senior graduate student & teaching staff member on call.

Duration:

(1) hour/ call for two calls/week for (40) weeks.

Bed Side Patient Care (1) "Ward Rounds":

The student makes round on the patients assigned to him. During the round, the patient history, physical examination, general assessment, diagnosis and plan of management are discussed by the teaching staff member who is caring for the patient. The students are expected to consult relevant literature before the rounds.

Duration:

(2) hours/round for (3) times/week for (40) weeks.

Introduction to Surgical Operative Skills:

Student are introduced to the operation, room in which live cases are being handled. The student assists to surgeon in carying out the operation.

Basic Principles of Surgery Seminr:

The student is required to prepare and presents at least four presentations per semester for a total of eight presentation per year on problem or issues dealing with basic principles of surgery. Topics are assigned by the department and presentations are attended by all graduates students and discussion is directed by the assigned teaching staff member.

(One meeting per week)

Surgical Case Presentation Seminar:

The student is required to present in a meeting, at least four surgical cases per semester for two semesters (total of 8 presentation/year). The meeting is attended by all graduate students in the department of general surgery and the discussion is directed by the assigned teaching staff member and is directed to preoperative diagnosis, investigations, applied therapeutic measures and prognosis.

SECOND YEAR COURSES

Neurosurgical Emergency Patient Care (Morning Case Review (2):

Same as first year. Input and preparation students is less intensive the first year.

Bed - Side Patient Care (2):

Same as first year.

Neurosurgical and General Intensive Care:

The student is attached to the section of anesthesia with sole responsibility in the intensive care unit. He should be taught principals of intensive care, ventillation, management of chest problems in the unconscious, water and electrolyte management, principal of management of multiple trauma, neurotrauma and post operative care of neurosurgical patients.

Duration:

1 month.

Neuro - radiological Techniques :

Student are attached to the Radiology Section for 3 months. He should be exposed to the different types of techniques used in investigations of neurological patients. He should be taught and perform himself all types of neuro - radiological techniques like x-rays of the skull and spine, myelography CT scanning & angiography. He should learn how to report on these and detect normal from abnormal results.

Duration:

2 months.

Neurological Diagnosis and Management:

The student is atteched to the section of Neurology/Dept of Internal Medicine for a period of 4 months, and 2 months in Pediartric neurology.

He is expected to see and examine neurological patients and paricipate in their management. He should attend all neurology clinics in association with a teaching staff member. He should participate in all activities in the dep. of internal medicine related to neurology.

Duration:

6 month.

Neuro - Pathology:

The student is attached to the Dept. of Pathology for a period of one month . He should be taught the techniques of staining neurological specimens, how to read neuro-pathological slides , the features gross & micropscopic of neural specimens. He should attened all post mortem examination, of the brain and spinal cord .

Duration:

1 month.

Neuro- ophthalmology:

The student is attached to the dept. of Ophthalmology for a period of one month, he should be taught about the examination of the acuity of vision, fundus and eye movement. He should learn how to examine and chart visual fields. Emphases should be given to afflections of the optic nerve and visual cortex and pathways. He should know all ophthalmological manifestations of neurological disease.

Duration:

1 month.

Out patient Care:

The student should see and examine with a member staff attending patients visiting the outpatient dept . He should suggest investigations and start management two hours twice weekly .

Neurosurgical Operative Skills (1):

Students attended operative sessions of cases handled and are expected to perform minor surgeries under supervision of the surgeon in charge, in addition to assistance in other procedures being performed (medium and major operations).

Duration:

Two times per week, 8 hours per day for 40 weeks.

Basic Neuroscience seminar:

One hour per week for 40 weeks in the following topics:

Microbiology

Gross anatomy

Embryology

Physiology

Biochemistry

Advances in these topics as applies to Neurosurgery.

Neurosurgical Case Seminar:

Same as first year, but in topics related to Neurosurgery.

Out Patient Care (2) hours twice weekly.

Trauma Seminar:

Held every week, one hour per seminar for 40 weeks, Students are required to prepare and present at leas four presentations per semester, a total of eight seminars per year . Presentation is made to all postgraduate students and one staff member in charge.

Mortality Morbidity Seminar:

Review of complication of operative cases and analysis of factors that are thought to have contributed to the death of the patient and the determination of the risk factors in each case (diagnosis of complication) and possible measures to minimise or to avoid risks, and management of such complication .

Duration:

One hour per week for 40 weeks.
